


INSTRUMENTAL CHECKLIST

Name of Instrument: Tuba



## Register Characteristics:



**Use in Ensemble**: Bass. Produces a somewhat fuzzy, round tone. May be used to double the double bass or low winds.

## Parts of Instrument:

Response Problems: Takes lots of breath. High range is easiest when louder. Be careful of air requirements in the low range. In general, avoid fast technical passages. The notes below the low F are weak and less solid so try to avoid them.

**Intonation Problems**: Lowest and upper register.

**Fingering Problems**: Differnet fingerings for each tuba. Additional 4th valve lowers the fundamental a perfect 4th.

## Other Comments:

- (1) Construction: Conical instrument.
- (2) Has a mellow sound but can be powerful in its strongest register.
- (3) Blends well with other instruments.
- (4) Speaks somewhat slugggishly in the lowest register.
- (5) Upper register is better given to the trombone.
