
Rounded Binary vs. Ternary Form



*May be a varied form of A or A fragment.

Closed rounded binary is the closest to ternary. Differences may be expressed as (1) the opening phrase or opening motive of A is not usually present at the beginning of B in ternary and (2) no new key area is reached or necessary alluded to at the beginning of B in closed rounded binary. If, for example, A is closed, new or varied material comes in at the beginning of B with some motion toward a new key, ternary is the best choice. If A is closed, new material comes in at the beginning of B and no modulation occurs, incipient ternary is the best choice. If A is closed, B opens with the same phrase or motive that began A with no new key area alluded to (secondary dominant activity of a brief kind would not be counted as alluding to a new key), then closed rounded binary is the best choice.
